Founded in 1962, the Cape Cod Symphony Orchestra (CCSO) is considered the premier cultural arts organization on Cape Cod and one of the largest orchestras in Massachusetts. With a reputation for blending innovation with accessibility, the CCSO combines a polished, professional standing ensemble of 85 musicians with world-class soloists and featured artists. This season, audience attendance has reached its highest level in the organization's 48-year history.

The orchestra, conducted by Artistic Director Jung-Ho Pak, performs five Classics concerts and three CapePOPS! concerts each season from September to May in the 1400-seat Barnstable Performing Arts Center in Hyannis, MA. During the summer, the CCSO performs to thousands of residents and vacationers at outdoor events.

Featured top-rank guest artists include pianists Jon Nakamatsu, Freddy Kempf, and Ignat Solzhenitsyn; virtuosos James David Christie on organ and Paul Neubauer on viola; violinists Joshua Bell, Miriam Fried and Ayako Yoshida. Pops artists who have performed with the orchestra include Celtic fiddler Eileen Ivers, soprano Megan Weston and trumpeter Byron Stripling.

Highly committed to education, the CCSO offers informative pre-concert talks prior to each Classics concert. Through its very successful *MusicWorks!* Education Programs, the CCSO offers an array of engaging programs that creatively involve students in learning about classical music, and reach more than 7,500 students Cape-wide.

The CCSO is governed by a 30-member Board of Trustees and employs eight full-time professionals. The organization is supported by the CCSO Guild and local volunteers.

The Cape Cod Symphony Orchestra is a member of the League of American Orchestras.
